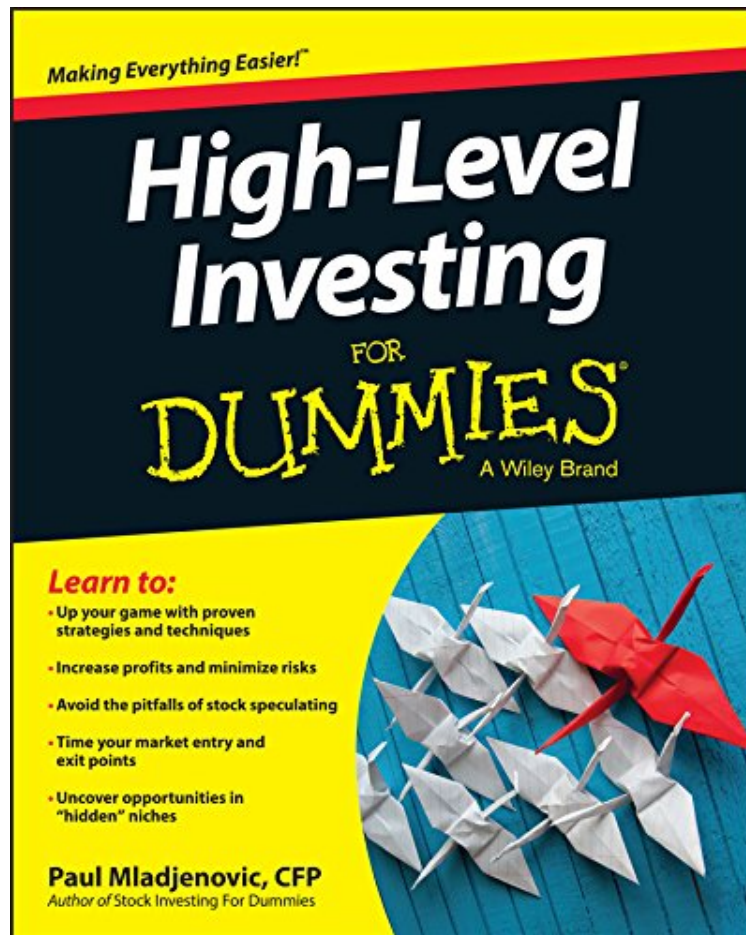

I have never felt that I had the qualifications to be a "stock picker", or that I had the time and information necessary to compete with the thousands of professionals working to find the next great undervalued stock.But when offered this book, High Level Investing For Dummies, I thought I should take a look at it in hopes that it would give me some insight into the world of stock picking, even if I have no dreams of becoming a wealthy day trader.Unfortunately, I'm don't feel any more prepared to become a stock picker after reading this book. There are good overviews of the types of investments available, the types of companies that can be invested in, and methods to increase returns (with increased risk). But I just felt like there was no enough concrete information

on what makes a particular stock a "good buy." Sure I can go to Yahoo or Zacks and use their stock screening tools, but what should I be looking / screening for? And what data is out there publicly that every other investor out there doesn't already know and have factored in to the price of the stock? I also felt that much of the data presented here is very nebulous. I read certain platitudes such as "don't get too greedy" with a good pick - but how do I know when I am getting too greedy? I do give the book credit for giving good explanations for many investment options, so as an investment glossary or primer it works. But for me I just didn't get enough practical information to put all of these investment options / strategies to good use, or at least to get enough confidence to test these options / strategies out with real money. Overall I give this book a mild recommendation.
