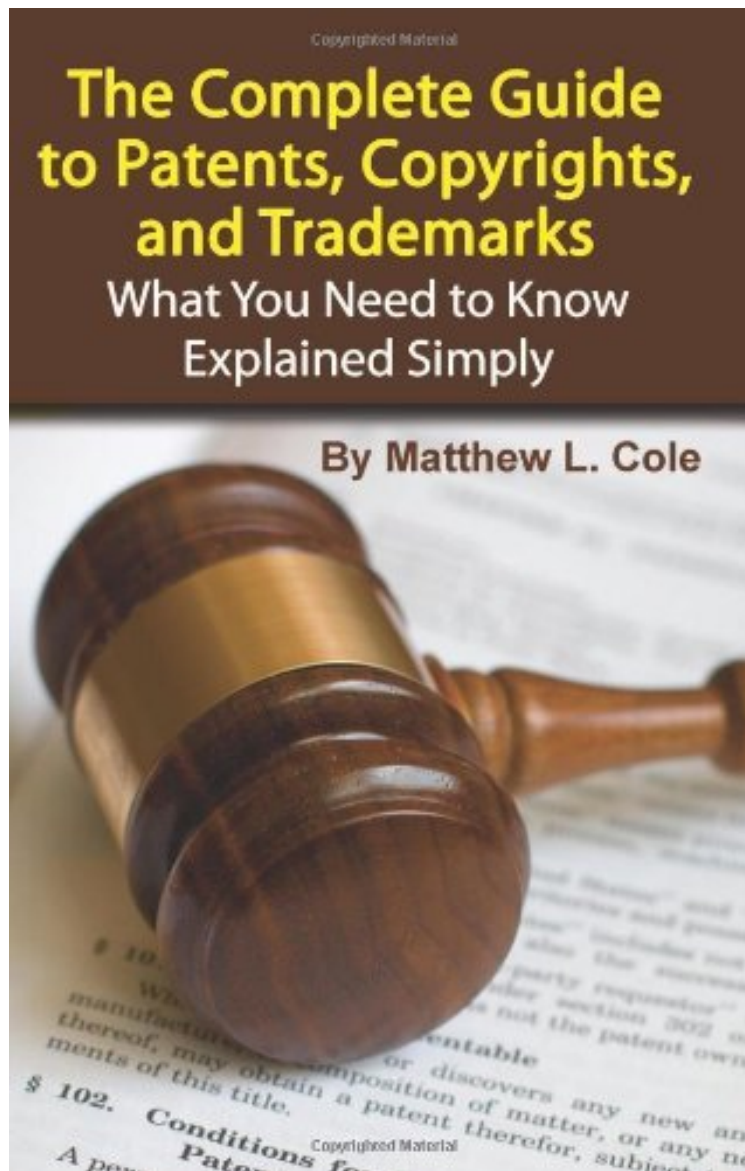

Cole's book focuses on the protection of intellectual property, and goes into detail explaining patents, copyrights, and trademarks. It is a valuable tome for today's small businessperson, inventor, and/or entrepreneur. Many people do not take the time to research the procedures regarding patents, copyrights, and trademarks, and Cole puts all of the necessary facts about protecting one's intellectual property through these methods at the reader's fingertips.Copyrights are explained first, as Cole breaks down the meaning of copyrighting and what guarantees it does and does not provide to the creator of an original work of authorship. He describes who qualifies as an author and/or owner of the copyright, what rights this gives the author/owner, and how long copyrights last. Cole also lists works that cannot be copyrighted, such as titles, names, slogans, and procedures. Copyright infringement is also explained, what qualifies as infringement and what recourse the copyright holder has against infringement.Cole turns to trademarks next, describing what kind of products they can protect. He tells readers how to conduct a trademark search and how to use the online trademark database of the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. Domain names and their trademarking are discussed also, as originality in domain names is becoming increasingly more important. In describing the trademark process, Cole tells readers, "Trademarking your product names, business name, logos, slogans, and domain names is one of the most significant business decisions you will make." He also notes what cannot be trademarked (descriptive words, generic marks, etc.) and how to fight trademark infringement.Finally, Cole discusses patents and how they can protect inventions. He breaks down the types of patents (biological, business method, chemical, software, mathematical algorithms, plant, design, and genetic patents) and notes what characteristics an item must have to be patentable (novelty, non-obvious, and have a useful purpose). He explains patent ownership, and how to search for a patent, then file a patent application. Utility model patents are also described, as is patent infringement and the patent owner's rights in that case.Cole has done an exceptional job in researching and compiling information on laws, sample forms, and repercussions surrounding the protection of intellectual property. This book is a fascinating entry into the world of copyrights, trademarks, and patents, and especially important reading for authors, artists, inventors, and businesspeople who are affected by intellectual property laws.
