As the title implies, the book attempts to cover ALL government jobs in the United States, but actually the emphasis is on the federal government. At about 300 pages there just isn't room to cover all the state, county, and city jobs as well, although Mannion does discuss and give some details of those too, and includes considerable contact information to research government jobs further. Mannion is helpful too in telling the reality of actually working in various jobs, with some of the pros and cons of each. Actually, the aspect of the book that I found most interesting was the overview of each department of the federal government, which is something that every American citizen should know, whether a person is searching for a job in one of them or not. And there's several chapters on applying for a government job - web sites, applications, resumes, interviews, etc., although I discovered that the web site details are a little outdated so you have to take that into account.
